NOTICE

The following resolution adopted by the Municipal Building Commission on the 24 th day of February 1970 shall become effective immediately:

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 1969, Section 624.72, Subs. 3 and 4, the following rules and regulations are hereby promulgated:

- 1. No one shall intentionally, or through coercion, force, or intimidation, deny or interfere with the lawful right of another to the free access to or egress from or to use or remain in or upon public property under the care and control of the Municipal Building Commission.
- 2. No one shall intentionally, or through coercion, force, or intimidation, interfere with the transaction of public business in or upon public property under the care and control of the Municipal Building Commission.
- 3. No one shall remain in or upon public property under the care and control of the Municipal Building Commission at the close of the usual and customary business therein conducted, unless authorized to so remain by an appropriate officer or employee of said Municipal Building Commission.
- 4. Any person who witnesses a violation of these rules and regulations shall immediately notify the proper law enforcement authorities.
- 5. These rules and regulations and the text of Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 624.72, Subd. 5, shall be posted in appropriate places in or upon public property under the care and control of the Municipal Building Commission.

Minnesota Statutes 1969, Section 624.72, Subd. 5:

Whoever, intentionally, or through coercion, force, or intimidation, denies or interferes with the lawful right of another to the free access to or egress from or to use or remain in or upon public property or in like manner interferes with the transaction of public business therein or thereon may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than one year or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or both.
